Our Vision Plan

Vision Statement: *The vision of the National Convocation is to be a leaven in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) under One God as One Church with One Mission in the world; as a voice promoting pertinent issues related to the African American Church, carrying out the biblical mandate, and to transform lives.*

Vision Plan: The International Convention adopted the “Principles for Merger of the National Christian Missionary Convention, the United Christian Missionary Society and the International Convention of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).” As a result of the adoption of the “Principles” document, the National Convocation of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) was formed to “nurture a realization of the merger vision.” The National Convocation is an expression of the church that is positioned to promote reconciliation, social justice concerns, and transformative congregations, equip and train clergy and laity leadership and empower congregations to do mission and ministry for 21st century. To accomplish these objectives the NCCC will empower and promote congregations in the following nine goals:

1. Leader Development and Faith Formation – (Ephesians 4:11-13)

NCCC endeavor to see others reap the riches of heaven necessary to transform the world around them. We strive to guide leaders to the source of ultimate power; the Holy Spirit and Word of God. Deeply rooted in scripture we desire to share our belief that leaders are formed from within. Genesis 1:26, 28 reveals that we were created for the task of leadership. As authentic leaders, our lives must affirm our devotion to Christ so that others long to know our Lord and Savior, Christ Jesus.

2. Model Oneness through the Merger Process- (John 17:21, Ephesians 4:11-12)

As NCCC move toward being a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world and being a Church that is part of the one body of Christ who welcomes all to the Lord's Table as God has welcomed us we must endeavor to conserve the deep Christian concerns and faithful expression of Churchmanship in such areas as: Evangelism, Stewardship, Christian Education, and Missions. The merger staff of Disciple Home Missions (as well as Administrative Secretary) in partnership with all General church and regional church staff will have the responsibility of aiding local Disciples congregations in achieving:

- Stronger/Healthier Connections with All Local Congregations and State Conventions
- Diversity in communication
- Teaching of the Merger Agreement and Disciples History
- Biennial Session
- Support for the Administrative Secretary's office
- Support of the work of the Merger Staff position as well as all African-American staff in the general and regional church
- Open Table

3. Promote Faithful, Vital and Healthy Congregations- (Acts 1:8, Romans 12:1-2)

The NCCC is commissioned and are sent for the conversion of many throughout the world to be equipped to use the power of the Holy Spirit through faith to restore God's people back to the place of originality, by taking its place of leadership to promote faithful, vital and healthy congregations; to persuade people to become Christians or revive their commitments to discipleship; to transform and re-emerge into a new and relevant life cycle through a process of profound and sometimes radical changes that orients the NCCC into a stronger, global church.

4. Ministerial Recruitment and Nurture- (1Timothy 2:5-8, Philippians 4:13, 14)

General Assembly Resolution 7147 provide nurture and training for African-American Ministers through working with lay and ordained ministry candidates in their identification and mentoring through development which involves consulting with regional commissions on ministry, colleges and seminaries. The Administrative Secretary along with the Merger staff will aid with conflict management, assistance in placement and enabling renewal through the Black Ministers Retreat.

7. Promote and Support Reconciliation and Social Justice- (Micah 6:8)

The mission of Reconciliation Ministry of the Christian Church is to plan and implement strategies to dismantle and eradicate racism within each expression of our Church. The Pro-reconciliation/Anti-Racism Initiative was founded upon the need to make visible God's beloved community. It invites all NCCC congregations to

- Listen to the once silenced voices of its racial/ethnic communities,
- Learn from their wisdom and gain insight from their leadership.
- It calls the church to discernment and prayer, study of the scriptures and reflection, dialogue and table fellowship.
- Seek out opportunities to partner with other Disciples organizations, affiliated agencies and congregations through community service and social justice work.

8. Promote and encourage good stewardship – (Galatians 6:7)

As the NCCC we recognize and honor the fact that God has created the world and all the abundance therein. Thus as people of God we recognize the need to give out of a sense of abundance and not scarcity. As the NCCC we endeavor to be examples and teachers of this principle to assist the church to sow and reap with a Spirit of Abundance.
