Greetings and Ministry Update

Terri Owens, General Minister

She has attended all but 6 regional assemblies. She stated that we are overcoming financial difficulty and leadership crises and she is very excited to have 6 Black women on board- the perspective and look has changed! Rev. Lee Hull Moses will become the new chief of staff in February. Our mission OGM's mission is to promote spiritual practice and biblical literacy.

Concerns and goals:

Connections- relationships w/ regions- a communications consultant is an ongoing part of the General Ministers Staff.

Seeking a grant writer to aid with funding to connect and update data and coordinate justice activities via a website, blogs, videos- whatever is best (i.e. leverage the information from the Poor Peoples Campaign and immigration issues.

Congregations need to understand our approach to theological diversity. The power lies within the congregation.

She thanked the group for feedback and asked for our prayers and stated that we have the power to change our narrative.

Donald Gillett, President NC

Stated that he would like to see a body that does more than gather to plan a biennial event.

Sotello Long, President DHM

Submitted a full report which is available for view. He stated that merger staff will make sure we are connected. We have two new ministry centers- Blue Theology Mission Station and Pacifica Grove. An executive leadership school will take place in January and we have a Leadership Initiative Team (LIT) which will help develop leadership by using the resources that DHM has put together.

Julia Brown Karimu, President Global Ministries

Stated that at Global Ministries "we walk the walk". The title Missionary has changed to Mission Coworkers- we are all coworkers with God. In 2017 there were over 109 Mission Coworkers and there are 290 partners around the world. She encouraged us to consider a People to People pilgrimage. There are 6 initiative programs- Caribbean, Congo, Middle East, India, Indonesia, and Sri Lanka. There are Global Mission Internships for young adults and college students.

Ministry Reports

Timothy James, Administrative Secretary

Submitted a full report which is available for view. He encourages us to attend General Assembly as this is the 50th anniversary of the Merger Agreement and we need to attend the anti- racism workshop as well as Sunday's meal. The joint convocation will take place in 2020 July 22- 25- still deciding on a location. The text for the event is Revelations 7: 9- 10. He needs the board members to respond to all correspondence.

Merger Staff Reports

Sheila Spencer, Christian Education and Faith Formation

Submitted a full report which is available for view. Stated that Merger Staff establishes relationships- connections and networks. Thanked the group for prayers and support as she received her Masters of Divinity. She mentioned two projects that have been supported-Spiritual Direction and Red Elephant HIV Awareness.

R. Wayne Calhoun, Evangelism and Congregational Transformation

Submitted a full report which is available for view. The goal is to reach 1000 congregations in transformation. Once a church is in transformation it is always in transformation—it is an ongoing process. He has served for 15 years as staff and 39 years in ministry and is still very excited. Star Supporter distributed 19 scholarships in 2017.

Chelsa Nickelson, Program Director Disciples Women

Submitted a full report which is available for view. She reviewed the 2018 NC DW luncheon (SUCCESSFUL) and discussed her busy schedule including LAP and regional events.

Fellowship Group Reports

Dee Long- for Sue Gray, Ministers Wives and Spouses

At NC, they gave \$500.00 to a local homeless shelter and they challenge other fellowships to go beyond the walls and give to local charities during each Convocation. Their goal is to reach as many ministers wives and spouses as possible. A concern is how to connect pastors to information about Pension Fund.

Pernella Shortie, Disciples Women

Submitted a full report which is available for view. Stated that DW wants to train young women to continue the work of DW. DW will focus on training, leadership, and raising \$25,000 in the next two years to aid with DW expenses.

Submitted a full report which is available for view. Stated that he always represents Black Ministers and there will an upcoming protest at the mall where the young innocent Black man was shot.
